

1 introduction in the last two decades there has been an explosive interest in the role of oxygen free radicals more generally known as reactive oxygen species—one of the fastest rising health conditions in the us is hypothyroidism the most common symptoms experienced are lethargy depression and **summary** stress leads to elevated cortisol levels which tend to weaken the immune system over the longer term this can also lead to adrenal fatigue the reduction of oxidative stress could be achieved in three levels by lowering exposure to environmental pollutants with oxidizing properties by increasing levels
